Copenhaver Family Trivia

Who was the first known Copenhaver in America? The answer is Johann Thomas. He arrived in Philadelphia on September 11' 1728. He took the oath of allegiance on the same day. He settled in Heidelberg Township which is near present day Myerstown PA.

Can you name some of the various spellings of the Copenhaver name? In Germany, the name is written Koppenhoffer. Once our ancestors were in America, the name was spelled by how it was pronounced. Based on family research, the family name appears in several forms on family and legal documents. Some of them include Copenhafer, Copenheifer, Kopenhaver, and Koppenhaver.

Library Committee

Your Library committee continues to advance the work begun by Robert Madison and Mildred Copenhaver by continually improving the Frederick and Eve Philippi Copenhaver Memorial Room of Smyth-Bland Regional Library's Southwest Virginia Heritage Library. We have installed the refurbished the will of Henry Copenhaver so generously entrusted to us by Phillip and his family. It is available for viewing by appointment only but a copy can be made for your jump drive.

Documents, pictures and bibles continue to be brought in for scanning into the digital archive which is now controlled on a remote server with a company called "iii". You will see this on the webpage for the library. Our family has its own link now on the SBRL archives: Go to www.sbrl.org. On their Home Page click on "S-B Digital Collection" then follow link "Family History" to "Copenhaver" button. You will see how many other families have now put their archives with this system compared to just us 18 months ago!

On behalf of the trustees and committee members let me express our heart-felt loss of Roberta M. Copenhaver this year. Her work on this library was phenomenal. Her book "Ancestors and Descendants of Judge John Alexander and Martha Matilda Peck Kelly from 1555-" is still on sale at the library. Purchase of this book will not only give you a magnificent genealogy resource but proceeds will benefit the library directly. Roberta's letters were lovingly complied and indexed by Martha-Pearl

Copenhaver Bates and Lelia Copenhaver Siebold. These volumes constitute a valuable primary document record for many marriages, births, graduations etc... and are now in the archives.

Having completed the current archive and preservation work, we now are looking to have laser photo engraving and small plaques to mark items now under contract with the library. We are working to index the archives with catalog numbers and connect our archives with others of similar size and interest. This process is ongoing.

Please bring your family photos, documents, and archival material to be scanned and given back to you! There is a strict policy of no bags in the room on the website. At last yearly report we had 120 visitors from 15 states including California signed the visitor register in the room.

The meeting of the Board of Trustees will be at 9:00 at the reunion site the Saturday of the reunion.
